

## **Invitation for Bids (IFB)**

*August 1, 2018*

*Russian Federation*

*Judicial System Support Project*

*Loan 17RU01*

***Creation of the Engineering and IT Infrastructure for Back-up Datacenter, Situational Center and Control Center of the Moscow City District Court Buildings, including Development of Required Software***

***IFB Number: JSSP/ICB/1.2.1.***

1. The Russian Federation has received a loan from the New Development Bank (NDB) toward the cost of Judicial System Support Project, and it intends to apply part of the proceeds of this loan to payments under the agreement(s) resulting from this IFB: JSSP/ICB/1.2.1 “Creation of the Engineering and IT Infrastructure for Back-up Datacenter, Situational Center and Control Center of the Moscow City District Court Buildings, including Development of Required Software”.
2. Non-commercial Foundation for Enterprise Restructuring and Financial Institutions Development (FER), which is authorized by Ministry of Economic Development to conduct the bidding and subsequently sign the contract in the interest of Moscow City Court with the selected Supplier, now invites sealed bids from eligible Bidders for creation of the engineering and IT infrastructure for back-up datacenter (DBC), situational center and control center of the Moscow city district court Buildings, including development of required software, which includes:
  - i) Survey of Data Center (DC) IT infrastructure.
  - ii) Implementation of the overall complex of engineering systems of the BDC, computing and telecom equipment complex, ensuring the disaster tolerance of the main DC of the Moscow city Court (MCC) with the full redundancy of all available DC services; enabling switch of work of users to work with the BDC in case of unavailability of the main DC.
  - iii) Implementation of the Situation Center (SC) at the MCC and creation of the Situation Center information and analytical module for operational analysis and control (IAM Situation Center).
  - iv) Preparation of the Situation Center premises, including repair and upgrading of MCC building services, installation of workstations at the district courts for connection to the Situation Center, and implementation of the IAM Situation Center functionality that would enable operational monitoring and analysis indicators for strategic decision making.
  - v) Establishing the Unified Control Center for monitoring and dispatch control of building services of the district courts and MCC;
  - vi) Provision of training necessary for efficient use of supplied equipment and software;
  - vii) Provision of required warranty.

3. Bidding will be conducted using the International Competitive Bidding (ICB) procedures specified in the NDB Procurement Policy (2016, as amended from time to time) and World Bank's Guidelines: Procurement under IBRD Loans and IDA Credits, edition of January 2011, revised July 2014, and is open to all Bidders eligible as defined in NDB Procurement Policy, that meet the following minimum qualification criteria:

a) Financial Capabilities

The Bidder's (single Bidder or Joint Venture) average annual turnover shall be at least USD 65 (sixty five) million (or an equivalent amount in a different currency) for the last 4 years (2014 – 2017).

If the Bidder is a Joint Venture, the average annual turnover of the Partner in charge shall be at least USD 45 (forty five) million (or an equivalent amount in a different currency) for the last 4 years (2014 – 2017). The average annual turnover of each Partner in a Joint Venture shall be at least equivalent of USD 30 (thirty) million for the last 4 years (2014 – 2017).

b) Specific Experience with Similar Projects

(1) The Bidder shall furnish documentary evidence to demonstrate that during the past three years (2015-2017) the Bidder must have completed at least 1 (one) contract for establishing the data center, including hardware (server equipment, data storage systems, telecommunication equipment), information security systems, engineering systems for at least 16 (sixteen) million US dollars.

(2) The Bidder shall furnish documentary evidence to demonstrate that during the past three years (2015-2017) the Bidder must have completed at least 1 (one) contract for development and (or) modernization of the software for government information systems for at least 7 (seven) million US dollars.

(3) The Bidder shall furnish documentary evidence to demonstrate that during the past three years (2015-2017) the Bidder must have completed at least 1 (one) contract for development and implementation of the information system for monitoring and dispatch control of building engineering systems.

Where the Bidder is a Joint Venture, lead Partner must comply with requirements (1) and (2) above and at least one Joint Venture Partner must comply with requirement (3) above, experience of the subcontractor would not be considered.

c) Technical (Organizational) Capacities

(1) The Bidder (or, if the Bidder is a Joint Venture, each member of Joint Venture) shall be certified in accordance with ISO 9001 or GOST R ISO 9001:2011 quality management standards.

(2) The Bidder (or, if the Bidder is a Joint Venture, any member of Joint Venture) shall have the highest level of partner's certification of the manufacture of existing server equipment, data storage equipment and networking equipment mentioned below and of the manufacturers of the proposed server equipment and data storage equipment for the computing service and manufacturers of the telecom system (if different from the manufacturers of the existing equipment):

- Cisco - Gold Certified Partner;

- Micro Focus Solution Partner. Identity, Access and Security Management;
- HPE Gold Partner;
- Hitachi - Gold Partner under the Hitachi TrueNorth Partner Program;
- Microsoft Enterprise Solution Provider;
- Microsoft: Silver Data Platform;
- Microsoft: Gold Datacenter.

(3) The Bidder (or, if the Bidder is a Joint Venture, any member of Joint Venture, or nominated subcontractor) shall be a member of the Self-Regulatory Organization in the Russian Federation (SRO) specialized in the area of engineering surveys, architectural and engineering design. The SRO of which the Bidder is a member shall have a compensation fund to secure contract obligations.

(4) The Bidder (or, if the Bidder is a Joint Venture, any member of Joint Venture, or nominated subcontractor) must have a valid license issued by the Federal Service for Technical and Export Control to perform activities involving the technical protection of confidential information.

(5) The Bidder (or, if the Bidder is a Joint Venture, any member of Joint Venture, or nominated subcontractor) must have a valid license issued by the Federal Security Service to perform activities involving development, production and distribution of ciphering (cryptographic) devices; information systems and telecommunication systems, protected by ciphering (cryptographic) devices; provision of services related ciphering of information and technical maintenance of ciphering (cryptographic) devices of information and telecommunication systems protected with the use of ciphering (cryptographic) devices.

(6) The Bidder (or, if the Bidder is a Joint Venture, any member of Joint Venture, or nominated subcontractor) shall be certified by the Ministry of Emergency Situations of the Russian Federation for installation of fire protection systems (fire detection systems, fire alarm systems, evacuation management systems).

#### d) Production Capacities

(1) The Bidder must have an office in Moscow, or a plan to have one established no later than by contract effectiveness. In the case of a joint venture this office must be of the lead partner.

(2) The Bidder (or, if the Bidder is a Joint Venture, any member of Joint Venture, or nominated subcontractor) must have sufficient capacity to perform warranty services for supplied goods.

(3) The Bidder must have production capacity and required expertise to implement prototype of IAM Situation Center. To comply with this requirement the Bidder must present the solution of the Test Case as described in the Technical Requirements par. 7.

4. Interested eligible Bidders may obtain further information from FER and inspect the bidding documents at the address given below from 10:00 till 18:00 Moscow time.

The application for the bidding documents must state the following information: a) the name of the potential Bidder, b) the address to which the bidding documents should be sent, c) the telephone and fax numbers, d) a statement that the requested bidding document is for Contract JSSP/ICB/1.2.1 "Creation of the Engineering and IT Infrastructure for Back-up Datacenter, Situational Center and Control Center of the Moscow City District Court Buildings, including Development of Required Software", and e) the potential Bidder's preferred mode of delivery of the bidding documents. The application should be accompanied by documentary evidence of payment of the non-refundable fee. Any information regarding the bidding process will be sent to the person and address of the potential Bidder in accordance with information in the application for the bidding documents.

Upon receipt of the written application and the proof of payment one set of the bidding documents will be sent by airmail for overseas delivery and surface mail for local delivery. Alternatively, if specifically requested by the potential Bidder, the FER will send the bidding documents by courier service at the expense of the potential Bidder. In such a case, the potential Bidder must supply the appropriate courier name and account number for its chosen courier service. Potential Bidders may choose to arrange courier pick-up of the

bidding documents at the office of the FER specified below. These methods for obtaining the documents should be coordinated with the contact person named below

6. Bids must be delivered to the address below at or before 14:00 Moscow time September 26, 2018. Bids need to be secured by a bid security. The amount of Bid Security required is USD 600,000.00 or an equivalent amount in the currency of Bid, or an equivalent amount in a freely convertible currency or in Russian Rubles. Late bids will be rejected. Bids will be opened in the presence of Bidders' representatives who choose to attend at the address below at 14:00 Moscow time September 26, 2018.
7. The attention of prospective Bidders is drawn to (i) the fact that they will be required to certify in their bids that all software is either covered by a valid license or was produced by the Bidder and (ii) that violations are considered fraud, which is, among other remedies, punishable by potential blacklisting from participation in future NDB-financed procurement.
